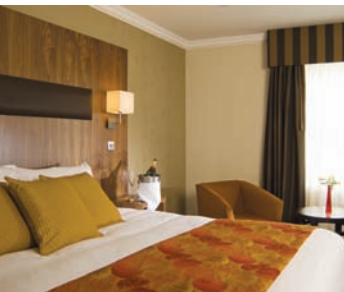

France: Bordeaux and its environs - September 18th 2009

Still the region of choice for fine wine investors – yet also the source of the rather lean and mean “Claret”. Just where do you look in Bordeaux for delicious, yet affordable wines? Our selection of six wines aims to make sense of the different styles associated with particular areas within Bordeaux and its near neighbours with helpful hints on where to find good value.

Portugal: Life beyond Port - November 20th 2009

Portugal has an enormous variety of grapes and many gifted winemakers, all too few of which we get to sample in the UK. We present a delicious selection of Portuguese wines from sparkling to dry whites and rich reds – and since no Portuguese evening would be complete without a Port, we finish our evening with one.

Western Australia: Perth and Margaret River - January 29th 2010

Many of Australia's most lauded and prestigious wines come from this area. Cooler than almost anywhere else in the country, this region excels at traditional Bordeaux blends, both red and white and world class Chardonnays. Firmly positioned at the “elegant” end of the spectrum these are wines that partner food perfectly, age well yet are never short of fruit.

France: The southern Rhone - March 26th 2010

Although we often associate this area with Châteauneuf du Pape and great value Côtes du Rhone, there's plenty of variety – rare and lovely fizz from the little town of Die, fresh well-made whites, juicy, earthy reds and the fortified Muscats of Beaufort de Venise.

Italy: The Veneto - May 14th 2010

Almost all the most familiar Italian wines come from the north eastern corner of Italy. This is the home of Soave, Prosecco and Valpolicella and of course Pinot Grigio. We all know that it's all too easy to end up with a really dull example of any of these wines so this evening focuses on what the best winemakers are doing to restore the reputation of this region.

New world/Old world: July 16th 2010

We take a pair of grapes and explore the different styles they create in the northern and southern hemispheres. Chenin Blanc can make top class sparkling wines, bone dry whites, complex oaked whites and world beating sweet wines. Syrah makes delicious gusty Rose, elegant perfumed silky reds and rich red blockbusters too. Climate pays the major role – geography a close second – we look at what determines the result.
